About the Programme

Our site consists of John Wesley's House, The Museum of Methodism and Wesley's Chapel. This versatility means we can offer a unique and exciting education programme for your students to experience.

During a visit your group will have workshops led by our Education Team in the House, Chapel and Museum, exploring the roots of Methodist heritage to understand how and why John Wesley wanted to change the world around him for the better and went on to set up the first free dispensary in London, campaigned against slavery and actively sought to do good.

Outlines for each part of the visit are listed below:

John Wesley's House (40 mins)

Using hands-on activities students will explore:

- The 18th century kitchen
- The local Georgian community
- How did John Wesley live?
- John Wesley and his work helping others

Wesley's Chapel (40 mins)

Using hands-on activities students will explore:

- Change and continuity in relation to the Chapel itself and Methodism in society
- Methodism and the Abolition movement

Museum of Methodism (40 mins)

Through interactive trails and object handling students will learn more about:

- Who was John Wesley?
- The beginning of Methodism
- John Wesley's views on slavery

Curriculum Links

Booking a visit

Please contact the Learning & Community Engagement Officer to arrange a date to visit. We can accept bookings for schools on Wednesdays, Thursdays and Fridays.

To experience all three activities, sessions can take up to 3.5 hours (eg 10.30am – 2pm), including a lunch break. However, this will vary depending on your group size and the activities they want to take part in. Once a date had been arranged, you will be sent a booking form to complete and return to the Learning & Community Engagement Officer. A timetable for the visit will be sent once the booking form has been returned.

Please be aware that the Chapel is a place of worship and should be respected.

Please also be aware that the site will be open to other visitors and the general public.

As the graveyard is outside pupils are advised to dress appropriately for outdoor weather if visiting Wesley's grave.

Access

Wesley's Chapel and Museum of Methodism are suitable for wheelchairs and disabled access, however, Wesley's House is not as the rooms are only accessible via numerous stairs.
